WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

Welcome to Holy Week!

This year's Chrism Mass takes place at 1:00pm on Monday at Saint Peter Cathedral, Erie. The blessing of the holy oils that we use for our sacraments throughout the year takes place at this Mass. Many of our diocesan priests will be in attendance and it is a beautiful Mass. All are welcome to attend.

On Thursday we begin the summit of the Liturgical Year with the celebration of *The Sacred Paschal Triduum* (TRID-oo-um) during which we celebrate the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus into new life. In our parish we begin together with our evening meal on Holy Thursday at 6:00pm at Saint Hippolyte. The Mass of the Lord's Supper follows the meal at 7:30pm. On Holy Thursday, Christ commands us to love one another and we symbolize this by the Washing of Feet. A time of Eucharistic adoration at the Altar of Repose follows this Mass. [Return your CRS (Catholic Relief Services) Rice Bowl to any of the services this week or next.]

Please join us at 3:00pm on Good Friday at Saint Hippolyte as we celebrate the Passion of the Lord. On Good Friday we have a solemn Veneration of the Cross. We commemorate this day by departing in silence as we continue our paschal fast and wait for Holy Saturday.

The Great Vigil of Easter is celebrated on Holy Saturday at 8:30pm at Saint Hippolyte. We begin with the lighting of the fire and the blessing of the Paschal (Easter) Candle. We then recount the story of our salvation history with readings from scripture. The Alleluia again returns before the proclamation of the Gospel. After the homily we will welcome into full communion our catechumen: Zack Jerman.

Following the Easter Vigil we move to the social hall for our annual Break—Fast celebration. All are encouraged to bring Easter foods and goodies to share with our parish family and friends.

On Sunday morning we continue our celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord during our regularly scheduled 11:00am Mass at Saint Hippolyte. The Paschal Triduum officially ends with evening prayer on Easter Sunday.

Let us use this week to add a sacrifice and create a space for silence for our Lord to grow more deeply in our lives. And let us not forget that next Sunday the Easter Season is just beginning, and does not end until Pentecost.

Have a blessed Holy Week, Triduum, and Easter Season.



On Holy Thursday this week, let's reflect on Jesus' not only instituting the Eucharist but also the priesthood at the same meal. During the Last Supper, Jesus offered himself as the Passover sacrifice, the sacrificial lamb, and taught that every ordained priest is to follow the same sacrifice in the exact same way. Jesus gave us what is essentially His last will and testament in His High Priestly Prayer, all of John 17. Meditate on that chapter this week.

Jesus prayed for unity for His flock, and it's through the Eucharist and the priesthood that God maintains this unity. Jesus not only prayed for it, He then sacrificed Himself to make it happen.
