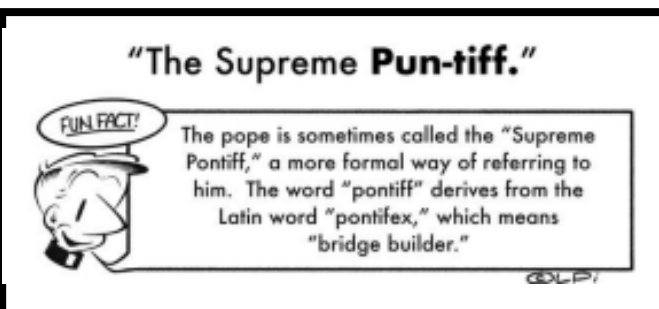

St. Paul St. Evangelization: Bless your children

Parents have the vital responsibility of raising their children to love the Lord and guiding them toward heaven. The Catechism of the Catholic Church emphasizes that parents, as the first heralds of faith, are called to evangelize their children and introduce them to the mysteries of the faith from an early age. A simple yet powerful way to fulfill this mission is through daily blessings. By making the sign of the cross on their child's forehead or heart and offering a short blessing—such as “May God bless you and protect you”—parents can provide a sense of safety, love, and spiritual connection. This practice not only strengthens a child's faith but also fosters peace and encourages lifelong devotion to God.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments—Teach Children to Protect Themselves at Home Keeping kids safe starts at home. Talk to your children about simple ways they can protect themselves: Know who's at the door—Never open it for strangers. Keep personal info private—Don't share your name, address, or phone number with anyone you don't know. Emergency contacts—Make sure your child knows how to reach you and call 911 if needed. Safe boundaries—teach them to say “no” to anything that makes them uncomfortable. Online safety—Remind them not to share personal details or passwords online.
