

What is a Saint? A saint is someone who has left us with examples of how to serve God and are recognized for their holiness. Some saints died defending the faith, some taught lessons against heresies, some are Popes. There are many ways to look at saints in the Catholic culture, they exist in every era, every country, and in every world culture. Some saints were black slaves like St. Josephine Bakhita, American Indians like St. Kateri Tekakwitha, priests like St. Maximillian Kolbe, Naval Chaplains like St. Vincent R. Capodanno, Koreans like St. Andrew Kim. Some were young like St. Dominic Savio (15 years old) and old like St. Raymond Penyaforth (100 years old). One of the newest saints is St. Carlo Acutis. Some were beheaded, had their eyes plucked out, had body parts removed, were boiled in oil, crucified, were fed to lions, and shot with arrows, you get the idea (do some research). Some died peacefully after a lifetime of teaching about God and the heavenly kingdom. St. Francis of Assisi gave the world the Christmas Creche, the Stations of the Cross, and was the first to receive the Stigmata. St. Hippolytus gave us the Second Eucharistic Prayer used at Mass. For this contest, we encourage you to study a saint that you want to represent in costume. You will need to tell the judges who you are representing, why you chose this saint, and when and where the saint lived and died. The award categories are the most gruesome death, the most authentic costume, the youngest saint, and an historically older saint.
