THE EASTER VIGIL

The Easter Vigil is the most important Mass of the year. In the complete ranking of all Catholic Church celebrations, the Triduum occupies the top spot. The Triduum, which begins with Holy Thursday's Mass of the Lord's Supper, concludes with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday; it reaches its climax with the Easter Vigil. If there is one Mass in which Catholics should make every effort to participate every year, it is the Easter Vigil. If you attend church Easter Sunday morning, but miss the Easter Vigil, you have missed the most important celebration of the year.

The Easter Vigil celebrates the Resurrection of Christ and the commitment of believers. It has four parts. It begins with a *Lucernarium* or service of light. The community gathers in darkness to hear that Christ is our light, shattering the darkness of sin. The next part of the Vigil is the Liturgy of the Word. We hear up to nine Scripture passages that tell the story of salvation, ending with the Gospel of the Resurrection.

The third part is the Baptismal Liturgy. Some catechumens have already been listed among the elect, those chosen for Baptism this year. They now come forward to be plunged into the waters of new birth. Anointed with Chrism, they celebrate Confirmation, receiving the strength of God's Spirit for the Christian life. Then the entire community renews its Baptismal Promises. Together we pledge our faith in the resurrection and promise to follow Christ more closely.

The Vigil culminates in the fourth part, the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The length of the celebration has sharpened our hunger for Communion. For the very first time, the newly baptized will join us in the Eucharistic feast. At the Easter Vigil, we recommit ourselves to our faith and rejoice with the newly baptized.

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month: Be Vigilant- Child Abuse Prevention Month should lead to heightened awareness of the need to be vigilant about providing a safe environment for all within the Church and for our communities. It is vitally important that we are constantly vigilant concerning the behaviors of those who interact with children and communicating our concerns to the appropriate parties. Each one of us can play an important role in strengthening this culture of prevention. For example, we can better prevent abuse by ensuring that the signs of abuse are identified and reported. Noticing these warning signs, taking them seriously, and reporting them could prevent abuse in the future. Exsultet

On special family days you bring out the best stuff—decorations, place settings and clothes that don't get used on other days of the year. We keep some treasures hidden away and bring them out for only the most important occasions. If you miss the celebration for some reason, you won't enjoy the treats it brings for another year.

The Exsultet, or "the Easter proclamation," is one of those special treasures owned by our church family. We bring it out once a year at our most important celebration, the Easter Vigil. If you miss the Vigil, you don't get to enjoy it till next year.

The Exsultet proclaims the meaning of Easter. It was written to be sung by a deacon at the beginning of the Easter Vigil. It comes during the first part of the service, the *Lucernarium*, or service of light. The Vigil begins outdoors where a new fire is blessed and the new Paschal Candle is lit for the first time. Then the assembly processes into the church, carrying tapers lit from the same fire and proclaiming, "The Light of Christ. Thanks be to God."

Once inside, in a church aglow with new light, we hear the meaning of this night in the Exsultet. First, the proclamation calls on the angels, the earth, and the Church to rejoice. "[L]et the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our might King's triumph!" Then it begins to sound like a Preface. "It is truly right and just, with ardent love of mind and heart and with devoted service of our voice, to acclaim our God."

Finally, the Exsultet tells us how special this night is: "These, then, are the feasts of Passover, in which is slain the Lamb." The Easter Vigil celebrates the Christian Passover, complete with banquet, freedom from slavery, light from darkness, cleansing from sin, restoration of holiness, and resurrection from death.

No wonder the Exsultet proclaims the sin of Adam to be a "happy fault," a "necessary sin." Because of Adam's fall, we have been restored at Easter through Christ.

Someone other than the deacon may sing the Exsultet if he lacks the skills to sing or if the parish lacks a deacon. It has a long and short form. It proclaims the meaning of Easter, so we save it for this, the single most important night of the Christian year.

A Blessing for Your Easter Meal

All make the Sign of the Cross to begin.

Leader: Christ is risen, alleluia!
All: **He is risen indeed, alleluia!**

Intercessions

As a family, offer all your intercessions and intentions to God.

All join in praying the prayer Christ himself taught us.

Prayer of Blessing

Leader: God of glory, the eyes of all turn to you
as we celebrate Christ’s victory over sin and death.
Bless us and this food of our first Easter meal.
May we who gather at the Lord’s table
continue to celebrate the joy of his resurrection
and be admitted finally to his heavenly banquet.
Grant this through Christ our Lord.

All: **Amen.**





Concluding Rite

All make the Sign of the Cross over themselves as the leader says:

Leader: May Christ nourish us and strengthen us in faith and love,
now and for ever.

All: **Amen.**

The blessing may be concluded by a suitable Easter song.
