WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

PARTICIPATION

You come to Mass not as a spectator, but as a participant. Vatican II's *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* says in paragraph 14 that the full, conscious, and active participation of the people is their right and obligation as the priestly people of God (1 Peter 2:9).

The phrase "full, conscious, and active participation" expands a sentiment expressed by Pope Pius X in *On Sacred Music*, where he urged the assembled faithful to acquire the true Christian spirit from its source: "active participation" in the mysteries and solemn prayer of the Church. When he wrote this in 1903, most people prayed devoutly at a typical Mass, but not yet fully engaged with the liturgical action exercised by the ministers in the sanctuary.

When the Second Vatican Council promoted this idea in the 1960s, it called for a participation that was not only "active," but "full" and "conscious" as well; it gave these examples for its execution: acclamations, responses, psalms, antiphons, hymns, actions, gestures, and bodily attitudes (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, 30). In 1967, the Sacred Congregation of Rites issued an instruction on sacred music, citing these passages from the Council, and calling for both an internal and an external participation of the people.

As a result, when you come to Mass you have words to say, songs to sing, gestures to make, and postures to assume. But all these external actions should be supported by an internal sense that gives them deliberate meaning.

This is why the famous Catholic "Sunday obligation" appears in the *Code of Canon Law* not as an obligation to "go" to Mass on Sundays and holydays of obligation — but to "participate" at Mass on these days. The obligation is more than just being there. It is to sing and respond from the heart.




The Church's promotion of religious freedom expresses her solidarity with all people who seek the good and hope for fulfillment in the truth. *As Pope Francis teaches:*
