Scammers often refuse to send you information about the charity, won't answer questions or explain how the money will be used. They might even lie and say you've already made a pledge to donate. If you receive unsolicited emails from charities you have never heard of or have no association with, do not respond and do not click on links contained in them. Instead, verify the charity's legitimacy by using its official website. You can report financial fraud to the FTC here: https:// ReportFraud.ftc.gov.



FAITHFUL FACTS!

In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII called the first jubilee, also known as a "Holy Year," since it is a time in which God's holiness transforms us.

LIVING THE MISSION

In announcing the 2025 Holy Year, Pope Francis said, "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given to us." (Letter on the Jubilee Year of Hope, February 11, 2022). In what ways can you take this opportunity to celebrate your faith and the faith of others?

HEY, KIDS OF CHRIST!

The Year of Jubilee has a special logo or picture (see front) that represents something. The Jubilee logo has distinct colors and meaning: Red symbolizes love, passion and self-sacrifice, Christ's sacrifice and his boundless love for humanity; Orange expresses joy, vitality, and enthusiasm, the light that illuminates the path of faith; Green is universally recognized as the color of hope, growth, and rebirth, and; Blue symbolizes faith, peace, and tranquility, evoking the sky and spirituality, and inviting contemplation and prayer.

Charity Fraud

Here's how it works:




Someone contacts you asking for a donation to their charity. It sounds like a group you've heard of, it seems real, and you want to help.

But how can you tell what's a scam? Charity scammers want to get your money quickly. They often pressure you to donate right away. They ask for cash, gift cards, cryptocurrency, or wire transfers. Scammers often refuse to send you information about the charity. They won't answer questions or explain how the money will be used. They might even lie and say you already made a pledge to donate.

Here's what to do:

- Take your time. Don't trust your caller ID. Scammers use technology to make any name or number appear on caller ID. Tell callers to send you information by mail. Do some research. Is the charity real? If callers ask you for cash, gift cards, cryptocurrency, or a wire transfer, it's a scam.
- 2. Pass this information on to a friend. Probably everyone you know gets charity solicitations. This information could help someone else spot a possible scam.





Please Report Scams

If you spot a scam, please report it to the Federal Trade Commission.
