Adult Faith Formation Opportunity — We are in the process of forming a group for adults to focus on and discuss the book Forming Intentional Disciples: The Path to Knowing and Following Jesus written by Sherry A. Weddell. With the book the author leads you through the steps that will help Catholics enter more deeply into a relationship with God. Some stats to consider:

- Fully 10 percent of all adults in America are ex-Catholics.
- Nearly three-quarters of young Catholics think that they could be a good Catholic without going to Mass every Sunday.
- Catholic marriages have declined by almost two thirds since 1969, even as the number of Catholics in the United States has grown significantly.
- Only one third of Catholics believe that the bread and wine actually become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ at the consecration during Mass.

If the Church is to reverse these trends, the evangelizers must first be evangelized. In other words, Catholics in the pew must make a conscious choice to know and follow Jesus before they can draw others to Him. This book study is a great way to start! Something more to ponder....Hemorrhaging Faith was a study that showed why some young adults STAY in the church.

- 1. They had experienced Gods presence and love, and had seen God answer prayer.
- 2. They could openly discuss their spiritual experiences and questions within the community.
- 3. They had heard and wrestled with their spiritual experiences Great Story of Jesus (the Kerman) at a deep level.
- 4. They had experienced communities of faith and older adults living the Christian faith in authentic and compelling ways.
