Jesus asked St. Faustina to **Eucharistic** venerate His infinite mercy especially during the 3:00 pm hour, as that was the hour He

sacrificed Himself for us. Through her Jesus has asked the same thing of every one of us, that as often as we hear the third hour strike, we immerse ourselves in His mercy and glorify it, and invoke His mercy on the whole world. Jesus said, "I claim veneration of My mercy from every creature..." (*Diary* 1572).

"You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us. ... O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You." (*Diary* 84, 1319)

Here is some trivia about our parish and the Annual Frenchtown Ham or Chicken Dinner:

- 1833 The parish was founded by Jean-Nicholas DeMaison (from Voujeaucourt, France) and Jean-Claude Doubet (from Roye, France). (Look for their graves in the parish cemetery at Saint Hippolyte).
- 1834 Bishop Kendrick from Philadelphia first visits Frenchtown. He gave \$50.00 towards the construction of the first church.
- 1838 On August 15, 1838 Bishop Kendrick blessed the first church. This log (?) structure stood on land now occupied by the cemetery. The church was named after the French ancestral church of the Doubet family, Sainte Hippolyte.
- 1841 A large hand-carved primitive crucifix was presented to the church by its creator, J.C. Faiver. (This crucifix now hangs in the reconciliation room of Saint Hippolyte.)
- 1845 The first resident pastor, Rev. Marc-Antoine de la Roque, is named by the Bishop of Pittsburgh.
- 1866 Rev. Eugene Cogneville was named pastor of Saint Hippolyte by the Bishop of Erie. It was during this venerable priest's fifty year tenure that the present church was constructed. (You can visit his grave in Saint Hippolyte Cemetery.)
- 1888 The first fundraising dinner was held at Saint Hippolyte. On the menu was chicken fricassee. Games, bingo and square dancing to the music of local fiddlers added to the festivities.
- 1914-1917 The dinners were interrupted by the First World War. World War II also caused the cancellation of the "Frenchtown Picnic" during the 1940s.
- 1956 The menu changes to fried chicken, prepared at the homes of parishioners and brought to the church.
- 1970 The dinner was changed to ham for six years due to Department of Health regulations.
- 1977 Under the direction of Rev. Richard Mayer, barbecue pits were built and the menu changed for the final time: ½ Bar-B-Q Chicken or a generous portion of Ham, mashed potatoes, gravy, vegetable, applesauce, coleslaw, rolls and homemade pies.
- 2020-2021 The pandemic forced us to think outside the box. Dinners were served by pre-order only with our efficient drive-thru pick up system. Festival games had to be put on hold. In 2020 we served 1032 dinners and in 2021 we served 689.
- **2022** We were excited to return to indoor seating and to bring back a few festival games. Thank you for your continued support. 1,166 dinners were served in 2022 and 1,037 in 2023.
- **2024** It's our 128th year! We welcome all of our guests to today's dinner. Thank you for your continued support of this fundraiser which benefits both Our Lady of Lourdes and Saint Hippolyte. We appreciate all of our volunteers; without you this day would not be possible!
